

SHA LEGACY

From the Editor

Much like a small town school, Sacred Heart has graduated generations of family members during the 118 years of operation. The recent passing of **Ruth Milloy Olson '31** emphasizes how some of that legacy can go unrecognized. While reviewing her obituary I realized that she is the great grandmother of current and former students at SHA, although her children and grandchildren did not attend.

Similarly, a questionnaire completed several years ago indicated that **Mildred Kennedy Reume '22** was the grandmother of five **Morgensterns** from the 80s. Obviously when female alumni marry and change their last name it's easy to lose track of the lineage. But also, common names like Smith and Jones and, well, Theisen make it difficult to know which families are which.

Another factor is the older records where Welchs and Walshs and Welshs might have really all been the same family. According to **Sheila Arnold Hodges '55**, her mother is **Kate Walsh Arnold '33** but her aunt, Kate's sister, is listed as **Marie Welsh Sweeney '20** in the alumni records. Sheila also notes that her grandfather's headstone has **Welch** on it!

When the Centennial was celebrated in 1989 we tried to find offspring of the first graduating class without success. At this time the longest legacy I know of is **Nellie Garvin Carey from 1897** as she is the great, great grandmother of some graduates and current students. I've added a column to our address database called **Lineage** and we'll use it to track parents and siblings as much as possible.

Please email or send a note to the Alumni Association if you know of an unusual family history that we might not have recorded. By the way, the first class graduating class was 1893 and included five ladies: **Lillian Flood McMahon, Kathryn Kaiser, Louise Garvin Farrel, Mary McCue and Nettie McCray Blondheim**. I'd love to find out if there are any relatives of that group of ladies among our alumni.

ALUMNUS OF THE YEAR

Father John Cotter '65 is the 2006 Alumnus of the Year. The Award is given annually to the Alumnus who demonstrates the ideals of his/her Christian education through outstanding contributions to church, parish, school and community.

John worked as a chef at the Embers through college but when he graduated from CMU with a degree in accounting he accepted a position at Lybrand, Ross Bros. & Montgomery in Detroit. The military draft came calling and John entered the Marines in October of 1969, returning to work with his company, now merged as Coopers & Lybrand (now PricewaterhouseCoopers) upon discharge in December of 1972.

John entered the seminary in the fall of 1974 and was ordained at Sacred Heart on July 18, 1980. He spent time as an associate at St. Stanislaus in Bay City, Sts. Peter and Paul in Saginaw, St. John's in Essexville and St. Hyacinth in Bay City before becoming pastor of his first parish, St. Joseph in Rapson, in 1986. John was assigned to Beal City St. Joseph in 1994 and was there for twelve years until his most recent assignment at Sacred Heart in Gladwin.

30 YEAR ANNIVERSARY

The Sacred Heart Academy Foundation celebrated its 30th Anniversary with a dinner on November 3rd. This event was attended by more than 250 supporters of the Academy. The keynote speaker was **Bishop Robert J. Carlson**, the Bishop of the Diocese of Saginaw. Other special guests included former Pastors of Sacred Heart parish **Father Richard Jozwiak** and **Father Thomas McNamara**; former assistant Pastor, **Father Jim Bessert**; Sacred Heart Academy graduates **Father John Cotter** and **Father Ray Cotter**; current Sacred Heart Pastor, **Father Robert Byrne**; current Academy teacher, **Father Don Henkes**; and former Academy teachers **Sister Rita Wenzlik** and **Sister Genevieve Montrieul**.

Margaret "Tat" Heintz (wife of Robert '40) and **Dorothy Johnson (wife of Phil '21)** were recognized for their 30 years of service on the Foundation Board. The Foundation has set up a scholarship in each of their names to be given annually to an Academy student. The Foundation has given more than \$1,800,000 to the Academy since 1976, and plans to give more than \$200,000 this year.


Class of 99

2006 FOOTBALL

The 2006 Irish football team became the third team in school history to advance to the State Semi Finals (1978, 1998 were the other two), winning three playoff games before falling to Crystal Falls at Northern Michigan University. LOST!

The television show LOST has been viewed by millions over the past few seasons but so far there have been no reports that there are any Sacred Heart graduates on the island. But we do have several alumni that we have "lost."

In recent newsletters we have produced lists of alumni classified as "LKA," an acronym for Last Known Address. There has been good response to help identify some of those we have been missing. The LKA list is generated when mail is returned. The bulk rate we use dictates that the Post Office may return it (at a current cost of between 70 and 95 cents per piece!!!) if the address is not precise. By precise we mean that Streets, Ways, Drives etc. must be identified along with apartment numbers if required. Some of the return mail is easy to follow up on as it may be for the sibling of a neighbor or the child of someone who works down the street. But it is a time consuming effort when the list approaches 500 as it does now.

Of course recent graduates tend to move a lot as they settle into their careers and older alumni move to search out the sun, at least for the winters. Some on the list may have been missing for years and some may be deceased. But either way we'd like to get the records straight. Instead of creating portions of the list in the NEWS we have included a category on the sha.net website listing all current records the post office has deemed unacceptable.
