## GIRLS CROSS COUNTRY EARNS STATE TITLE



The Sacred Heart Academy girls cross country team brought home state championship honors this fall, literally running away with the Division Four Final Trophy, and winning pretty much every other competition along the way. According to 17-year Coach Mark Zitzelsberger, the team had no shortage of talent or motivation to win. "We participated in an invitational at Michigan State University mid-way through the season and some of the girls were posting times MSU had never seen before. Not just from a Class D school, but from any school." At the Division Four state meet November 7, the Lady Irish scored 52 points, beating a previous low record of 66 points scored by Harbor Springs in 2009. SHA also had five girls finish in under 20 minutes, which has never been done in Division Four finals history. Ready for more good news? This team is returning seven champions who will be back in 2016 to defend their title.

## EDITORIAL PAGE ... FROM THE ALUMNI DIRECTOR

## 40 YEARS!!!

Hard to believe but it's been over 40 years since this edition of the Sacred Heart Alumni Association began. The 1917 and 1918 Echoes From the Mount yearbooks reveal that there was an Association in that era, and, as this group began to plan, **Jerry Powell '50** noted that he had a checkbook and a small amount of funds from an Association that had been formed in 1971 but was discontinued just two years later.

The work began in the spring of 1976 as volunteers distributed class lists to compile addresses for communication. The first *NEWS* was issued October 3, 1976 and detailed plans for the October 30, 1976 Homecoming celebration that were already well in place.

The early newsletters were mimeo-graphed and hand addressed, sorted and banded and delivered to the post office. US Postal workers **Ed Ege '32** and **Gene Theisen '62** were instrumental organizing newsletters that were all over the floor and furniture in my house. Cheerleaders helped address letters along with several volunteers and we were underway.

**Sabina Kane Carroll 1906** was selected as Grand Marshal of the 1976 parade representing her entire class that was living for their 70th anniversary of their graduation, a group of five ladies that were 88 years young at the time. Sabina was a great source of information about the early years of the school.

Alumni constructed a float for past queens, **Jerry '47** and **Dorothy Voisin Sheahan'47** supplied an alumni sing along wagon, Sabina rode as Grand Marshal, representatives from each Homecoming court and football team from 1948 to 1975 were honored at halftime and the first annual Alumni and Friends Reception was held in the old Church basement.

And, as they say, the rest is history.

**EDITOR GOOFS** --- I have thoroughly enjoyed editing and producing these newsletters over these past 40 years. I have never been trained in journalism, in fact, I was a math whiz and my weakest subjects were grammar related. I know there have been several things I have written that would make Sr. Ann Lucile, Mrs. Johnson and Sr. Terenchia (and my mother!) cringe, but not all mistakes have been related to syntax.

For example, in the August, 2015 **NEWS**, I totally messed up the McDonald family! I believe it is a case of being too familiar. I know the **Gerald McDonald '50** family well. As baseball coach at Sacred Heart I enjoyed coaching **Tim '84** and **Pat '88** and also watched **Jeff '79** and **Steve '80** during their playing years. But, in the Class of 1979 note about Jeff's passing, I inexplicably noted their father was **John '51**! I also listed Pat as being from the class of 1987 but I know well that Pat graduated with my oldest son in 1988.

And it didn't stop there! In announcing Steve's selection for the Hall of Fame, I recorded his wife's name as Rachel, but his wife's name is Michelle...their daughter is Rachel.

Mea Culpa, Mea Culpa, Mea Maxima McDonald Culpa.

# STADIUM RE-DEDICATION

On August 28, 2015, the Mt Pleasant Community Memorial Stadium celebrated 50 years of service to local high school football and track teams with a season opening double-header featuring the Mt Pleasant and Sacred Heart football teams.

A local group calling themselves the Pillars of the Community, raised over \$600,000 and completed the improvement efforts including the new synthetic turf and a donation wall.

To help celebrate the occasion several members of the 1965 football and cheer leading squads were present at the game. That team was the first local team to win a contest at the stadium when it defeated Freeland on October 1, 1965. Dick Thering scored 3 touchdowns and Mike Heintz threw TD passes to Bob Brown and Mike Hackett in a 32-21 win that night.
