Although retiring from active priestly duties June 30, Fr. Loren plans to stay in central Michigan. "I have made many friends and I enjoy IRISH athletic competitions immensely. I want to reside in Mt. Pleasant and stay connected to the school," he says, adding that he will be available to help at the church when necessary as well.

Look Who's Creating

Alumni writing, illustrating & making music

While cooped up during the pandemic, **Dominic Thrasher (Mikey Sheahan Stahl '98)** said he realized he had time to face a fear, be courageous, and follow a passion he wanted to pursue. While watching his dog, Sheriff, play with his sister's dog, CeCe, he gave them voices in his head. "The voices soon made it to the computer, and they became a children's book," Dominic said. "A couple of weeks later, I had a 10-book series written."

The Adventures of CeCe and the Sheriff is now published, and the goal is to release a new book every six months. The next one in the series is due in June 2024.

Dominic said he reconnected with **Kara (Albaugh '99) Elmore** on Instagram. "I had worked with Kara on another art project and wanted her to illustrate the book. She is insanely talented," Dominic said.

The book is written at a third-grade level but can be enjoyed by all ages. Each book purchase comes with a 3D theatrical audio book, so anyone can listen and follow along. More than 1,300 books have been sold to date, and Dominic has enjoyed more than 20 book readings and signings, with Kara sometimes joining him. Mark Kostrzewa '81 recently announced the release of his third CD of all original acoustic guitar works, <u>WoodenHouse</u>. Mark got into the music scene 15 or more
