100 Years of Champions

Time to celebrate

Sacred Heart Academy's 2022 football season will be the 100th season of IRISH football. New Head Coach Josh Wheaton invites all alumni and friends to join in the tradition of IRISH football. SHA will celebrate "100 Years of Champions On and Off The Field" at every home game of the season. Here is the home game schedule:

Three to enter Hall of Fame at Homecoming

Three former Irish athletes will be added to the Sacred Heart Athletic **Hall of Fame** during Homecoming ceremonies on October 7, 2022, bringing the total number of honorees to 118. The Hall began in 1980 as a means to honor former athletes for their contributions to the history and tradition of Sacred Heart athletics. The 2022 inductees are **Kirt Hartman '97, Stephanie** (DeNoyelles '06) Brajak, and John Roberts '06.

Kirt (Sharon Campbell '65 & Earl Hartman '66), earned nine varsity letters and All-State and MVP honors on the #1 ranked State Runners-Up 1997 baseball team which had a school record 30-game win streak. He also started on the 1996 State Championship team and the 1995 #1 ranked semifinalist team. Kirt graduated in the top four of seven baseball categories, including a state record for career walks. Kirt was the second leading scorer on the football team and when he graduated, he held the school record for interceptions. Kirt and his wife Kristin live in Western Springs, Illinois with their three children. He is CFO of Gilson Capital in Chicago.

Stephanie earned four varsity letters in basketball and three in softball. Despite being slowed by a knee injury, she was MVP and earned All-State mention all four years in basketball while scoring 769 career points including leading the team twice, and graduating #4 on the all-time scoring list. She also earned All-State honors in softball where she graduated #1 in season hits and 3rd in stolen bases and runs scored. Stephanie and her husband Alex live in Traverse City with their three children. She completed her student teaching at Sacred Heart Academy, then taught first grade at SHA for two years before moving to Traverse City. She has been a Pre-K teacher for the Grand Traverse Area Catholic Schools since 2015.

John earned 12 letters in football, basketball, and baseball, in addition to All-State honors in football where he established career records in receptions and interceptions, and season marks for points and touchdowns. He earned all-conference honors in all three sports. John and his wife Amber live in New York with their three-year-old son Jaxson. John is the quarterback coach and Co-Offensive Coordinator at Long Is-land University.

"Camping trips, youth retreats, March for Life trips, Vacation Bible School—my years at Sacred Heart have all been great," she said. When Frank died in Lansing, the local Knights of Columbus Fourth Degree presented a chalice to his family in honor of his years of service to the Knights. The Courter family gifted it to Sacred Heart for these reasons:

- Frank graduated from Sacred Heart Academy in 1935, as did his wife, Betty (Naumes)
 Courter.
- Frank first joined the Knights of Columbus Sacred Heart Chapter (Jerry Campbell '35 was his sponsor). As the story goes, the K of C was the only place to drink on Friday nights, so all the 18-year-olds signed up. The Knights said they never had to have membership drives; the young catholic boys came to them!
- The Courters were married at Sacred Heart Church (the one on Illinois Street).
- Frank and Betty helped start the SHA Alumni Association, gathering contact information for their class and the classes before and after theirs.
- Frank and Betty always felt connected to Sacred Heart and the Mt. Pleasant community because of all the Naumes family members who remain in Mt. Pleasant.

The day the chalice was presented, May 10, 2022, was the one year anniversary of Frank's death. He lived to be 103 years old. The engraved chalice will remain at Sacred Heart Church for use at Masses. When raised, Frank's name is lifted in prayer and his memory lives on at Sacred Heart. A milestone year for our family

2022 is a milestone year in our family. Maggie (SHA '18) graduated from Central Michigan University in early May and Emma, the youngest of the Yonker trio, graduated from Sacred Heart Academy May 27. That morning, I told my husband, Steve, that we had accom-

plished a large parenting goal that day: the goal to have all three of our daughters receive a K-12 Catholic education. At times, it wasn't easy.

Maggie's first Catholic school was St. Michael Catholic School in Brunswick, Michigan, located between Fremont and Muskegon. A 77 passenger school bus stopped at the three Catholic churches in Newaygo County and picked up 15 students to transport them to school, so they could have a Catholic education. Parents dropped their children off at one of the

churches each morning and picked them up each afternoon. That school was approximately 30 miles from our house in White Cloud. At the end of Maggie's first grade year and right before Molly started kindergarten, St. Michael's closed (right after its 50-year celebration). We were devastated and didn't know how we were going to keep our girls in Catholic schools.

That summer (2007) we discovered St. Mary Catholic School in Big Rapids, 40 miles from our house and 50 miles from our places of employment, with no bus that stopped at local Catholic churches. Over the next five years we would carpool with friends, hire students from Ferris State University to drive our girls

home, use latchkey services when they had sports, and put a lot of miles on our vehicles. St. Mary's was a K-8 school, so we would need to make another decision for high school. Maggie did her research and thought we should move in time for her to begin 7th grade at

Sacred Heart Academy, since that is a transition year for all students. (She did not realize that getting two new jobs, selling and buying a house, and basically uprooting our life would take more than a day or two.) God is good. Steve and I both got jobs, and we only had to live apart for one month! Selling the house was a much bigger challenge, but the girls' education and coming to Sacred Heart was at the top of our priority list.

On August 27, 2012, Maggie, Molly, and Emma started at Sacred Heart Academy in 7th, 5th, and 3rd grades. This decision would change their lives forever (and ours, too). It wasn't until January 2015 that I joined them at Sacred Heart, accepting the role of Principal.

Why choose a Catholic school? There are other schools with small class sizes and rigorous academics. Other schools have award-winning extracurricular and athletic programs. Sacred Heart Academy is committed to the mission of Jesus Christ. Each student receives Catholic

religious instruction every day. The world today has many challenges, and at Sacred Heart Academy, students are taught to rely on God in times of need, joys, and sadness. Even if students stray from their faith for a while, they have a foundation which can't be taken awav from them. Students are taught that they are made in the image and likeness of God, that they are loved by God, and that He always wants what is best for them. What could be better than that? Each of our girls left Sacred Heart Academy

ready for the next phase of their life, and we are so grateful to each person who taught them, coached them, guided them, and was a role model for them.

At graduation each year, I remind students that a Catholic education is both a privilege and a sacrifice, and I ask them to thank those who helped them on the journey to graduation. Was it a sacrifice to provide a K-12 Catholic education for our girls? Yes, it was. Was it worth it? Absolutely, and we'd do it all over again! This fall, I begin a new phase at Sacred Heart Academy, coming to school without one of my girls enrolled. While it will be different, they are off doing great things, and I can't wait to see what's next!
