## Faith in the Future campaign focused on achieving the goal



#### Capital campaign goal is \$1.5 million

Campaign Chairpersons Megan (Spence '03) & Andy **Theisen Jr '02** have reported good progress in the early months of the Faith in the Future capital campaign community phase. As of December 10, 2024, a total of \$1.146 million has been raised toward the \$1.5 million goal, which is 76 percent along the way to success. "We know the last 25 percent— that final \$375,000—won't be easy, but we already know of a \$50,000 gift on it's way to us now, so we are motivated to work even harder and keep the gifts coming in," said Andy Jr. "We won't stop until we have not only met, but exceeded

our goal. Sacred Heart Academy is worth every bit of the effort, and definitely worth each donor investment."

Lindsay Ley, Sacred Heart's Development Director, said the Theisens have been working above and beyond to secure donations for the campaign. They have also helped to promote the individual projects which the campaign supports, she said, some of which have already been completed. "The upgraded bathrooms in both buildings have had the biggest impact," Lindsay said. "Last year we had multiple service calls due to plumbing issues, and we have had zero since the completion. The handsfree features have also helped with keeping the bathrooms clean and efficient." Lindsay said during tours at Homecoming, alumni groups commented on how the school "feels the same as it did years ago," because it is nice to see updates which preserve the history of the Academy.

A part of the campaign which has received overwhelming success is the prayer grotto, Lindsay says. "Thanks to the generosity of donors, ground was broken before the winter frost and planners are hoping for completion in early Spring, before the end of the school year, so we can celebrate that success together," Lindsay said. "However, people should not see these projects happening and think the campaign is over. We still need support to complete everything on the list—even the behind-the-scenes work. We need to win this campaign."

## Athletic Association introduces The Irish Club

The Sacred Heart Academy Athletic Association is proud to announce the formation of **The Irish Club**! The club has been created as a way to bring fans together, engage them, and support our athletes financially, all at the same time. As most of you know, the Athletic Association has always been very proud of the fact that SHA has never required student-athletes to 'pay-to-play', which is rare in today's world of rising athletic costs. As with so many aspects of our daily activities, costs such as uniforms, game officials, transportation, and numerous other expenses are constantly increasing, resulting in the need for the Athletic Association to develop a means of offsetting these expenses. We believe **The Irish Club** is a great solution which will provide a funding resource. You can consider it a sort of 'rainy day' fund for all of our athletic teams.

How does it work? The Irish Club has an annual membership fee of \$200 to join for the current school year. The annual fee includes a unique to Sacred Heart athletics gift, as a token of our appreciation for your support. This year's item is a red Adidas pullower which can be given to any member of your family as a visible sign of your support of a our athletic teams. If you elect to join, the fee covers your entire immediate family (parents and children of those parents living in the same household), and your family is eligible for any Irish Club events that take place throughout the year.
