Andy '78 and Julie Flannery Theisen '78 have been named SHA's 2017 Alumni of the Year.

The 2017 Alumni of the Year are **Andy '78** and **Julie Flannery Theisen '78**. The Theisens have been active parishioners in Sacred Heart Parish and Sacred Heart Academy, having donated hours of time behind the scenes for the church and working tirelessly on SHAgala for many years.

Andy has donated countless hours to Sacred Heart, including time spent on the "All Are Welcome" improvements to the parish, time in the new STEM Lab at the high school, clean up on Saturday mornings after Fish Fry, and volunteering as an assistant coach for SHA boys basketball. Andy is also an SHA Foundation Trustee and serves on the "Pillars of the Community" Committee to improve Community Memorial Stadium.

Julie came out of retirement from the public schools and now teaches first grade at Sacred Heart. Both Andy and Julie are Board Members of the Keisha Y. Brown Angel Wings Fund, which benefits Sacred Heart Academy. The couple also served as the Ambassadors for the 125-year celebration ceremony, making a donation for the right to ring the Academy bell 125 times. Andy and Julie are part of the longest legacy of (family) attendance at SHA. They can trace their roots back over 130 years. Andy's grandfather is **Gerald Theisen '20** and his dad is **Bob Theisen '50**. Julie's grandfather is **Tom Carey '23** and great grandmother is **Nellie Garvin Carey '1897**. HIGH SCHOOL STUDENT ON NATIONAL TV

PROJECT RUNWAY STAR SAYS SHE HAS MORE TO ACCOMPLISH

Sacred Heart Academy Student Isabella Kostrzewa, known as “Izzy” to her family and friends and now to most of the world as well, put her “hopes and dreams” along with Mt. Pleasant, Michigan in the limelight recently as a contestant—and finalist—on Lifetime TV’s “Project Runway Junior”.

Izzy, a 16-year-old 11th grader and the daughter of **Mike ’68** and Lily (a nationally-known artist), was selected from thousands of entries across the United States to participate in the reality series. She said she saw the first season of the show and knew she could compete if she could get an interview. Encouraged by her Aunt **Julie Kostrzewa Staudacher ’82**, she completed the on line forms, adding just the right amount of humor, personality and creativity. She was invited to New York for a semi-final audition and then earned one of 12 spots in the show which taped in July and August of 2016 but did not air until December.

Week after week of the show, Izzy created bold and stylish designs to stay in the do-or-die competition. The first week, she wowed judges with the best design. In two of the later weeks, she had lower scores, but managed to stay in the competition when others were cut. Along the way, judges described her designs as “fresh”, “bold”, “phenomenal” and “polished”. Izzy was also complimented at different times for the detail in her design and for her keen knowledge of the value of “branding her label”. In the end, she finished as one of the finalists, earning the opportunity to feature her collection in a runway show and compete for the show’s top prize in an episode which aired at the end of February 2017. Her overall fourth-place finish did not dampen her spirits in the least.

“I learned a lot of critical thinking skills,” Izzy said about the timed competitions. “I also learned more about the fashion industry and what matters in design.” Izzy is quick to add that she also made friends. “[Fashion Consultant and Show Host] Tim Gunn is the nicest person you could ever imagine,” she says. “I adore him!”

Izzy says her appearance on the show was “just a first step in a long journey. There is a lot more to come,” she says. First, she is planning a low-key Senior year at Sacred Heart Academy, since Junior year has been filled with excitement. “I have done at least 50 media interviews!” she said, including high-profile ones like her appearance on the Harry Connick Jr. Show, where she presented him with a custom-designed bomber jacket. Izzy made a similar jacket for the school’s SHAGala Auction and it was a hit there as well.

In addition to her sewing skills, Izzy also plays tenor sax in the public school Jazz Band, is a member of the volleyball team, and has won awards for her writing and from the prestigious Grand Rapids Art Prize for her filmmaking abilities. In the years to come, she definitely wants to find a role in the fashion industry, and plans to attend either the Fashion Institute of Technology or Parsons School of Design, both located in New York City, after high school graduation.

She will cherish the memories and experience from Project Runway Junior, but says she continues to enjoy fun times with her fellow athletes at SHA, dancing with her friends in the hallways near their lockers, and walking through downtown Mt. Pleasant, which are what she considers “good times”. Izzy has requested permission to paint a mural on a wall at SHA and hopes to leave her mark at the school that way. “Mrs. Hemmingson (art teacher) who is my

favorite teacher of all time and has always been supportive of me, has told me, ‘Don’t let anyone or anything put a box around you. . . there should be no boundaries to your creativity’. I am going to remember it always,” Izzy says. “I have more to accomplish.”



WHAT'S DIFFERENT ABOUT SACRED HEART ACADEMY?

Prospective families often ask me what's different about our school. One thing I tell them about the students at Sacred Heart Academy is that our students each fill multiple roles--- we need them to. Because we are small, we need students to not only be in the band but also on the field, court or track, and be an Extraordinary Minister of Communion at our school Masses.

We need them to be in the play, be on the quiz bowl team and participate in the March for Life pilgrimage or recent mission trip to Costa Rica or we would not be able to offer these activities and opportunities.

Many times, an environment at a larger school can be very intimidating or competitive, requiring a student to pick which role they want to pursue, and then spend all their time perfecting the role to keep it. One might think because we are small, we may not be that competitive in our extra-curricular activities, either academic or athletic. However, that's not the case.

Recently at Sacred Heart, we have celebrated numerous accomplishments made possible by many students filling multiple roles. Senior Devin Humphreys was recently notified he is now a Merit scholar finalist. He is also on the award-winning quiz bowl team, in the honors band, and placed at the regional Science Olympiad competition, thus qualifying for state competition. The boys' basketball team won a district title and several of the players participated in the March for Life pilgrimage, are National Honor Society members, and one is in the band. The girls' basketball team ended the season by playing in the semifinals at the Breslin Center. Many of those players are members of the Model UN team and won the Mid State Activities Conference in Forensics. Our student senate is comprised of several students who are also members of the two-time state champion cross country team and run track, not to mention National Honor Society members.

In the middle school, just about every Builders Club member, if not all, belong to one or more extracurricular activities. Many are in the band, on the dance team and/or basketball team, and compete in Science Olympiad.

We know how important extracurricular activities can be for developing students into leaders and increasing

their self-confidence. Many of the activities or teams are comprised of students throughout high school, not just the upper grade levels or lower grade levels. Therefore, the students are interacting with students outside their grade level which provides many benefits. Younger students get to learn from the older students and the older students have an opportunity to mentor the younger students. This helps to create a respectful relationship as the team or activity might not be possible without the participation of the varying grade levels.

At Sacred Heart Academy, a student can be everything they want to be. Many times, it may take the encouragement of a teacher, advisor, or a staff person to get the student to go outside their box and try a different activity. It's very rewarding to see students take a chance, share their dream and eventually become very comfortable in that new role. COMMUNITY SERVICE HOURS – HELPING PREPARE STUDENTS FOR THE FUTURE

Many of you know Sacred Heart Academy requires students to have 100 community service hours in order to graduate. Students begin earning hours in 7th grade and they must be completed by the end by 12th grade. Students fulfill this requirement in a variety of ways: visiting patients at local nursing homes, working at the foodbank or rotating homeless shelter, tutoring elementary students, and more.

This year 15 SHA students attended a mission trip to Costa Rica during their spring break with our Spanish teacher, April Dice. This is a valuable experience which will surely change the way they look at the world, and hopefully encourage them to pursue more mission trips.

Before Christmas vacation this year, two of our most recent alumni, **Katelyn Eidenberger '16** and **Rachel Hauck '16** came to school to ask if there was any volunteer work needed during Christmas break. They both signed up for a shift at the rotating homeless shelter (yes, on their first Christmas vacation from college). This was a paragraph Rachel wrote after volunteering: "Over our winter break we volunteered as hosts at the traveling homeless shelter. We have volunteered at the traveling shelter before through other churches, but this time was special as we were able to work with other parishioners. We helped serve dinner, played a lot of euchre, and spent some time playing with the younger children. This gave us many opportunities to have wonderful conversations as we met the guests. Volunteering at the homeless shelter is an eye-opening experience, and teaches us to be grateful for our lives and more appreciative for the things we have."

Katelyn and Rachel both attend Michigan State University and are members of an MSU organization called *Spartans Involved in Community Service*. The club encourages them to branch out into the community and do what they can to make a difference. We appreciate Katelyn and Rachel coming back to Sacred Heart to make a difference. Dr. Thomas & Mrs. Jayne Keating Scholarship

Established Winter 2017: The principle of this fund creates interest which will be made available each year to Sacred Heart Academy for tuition assistance scholarships.

Language Arts Fund

Established Fall 2016: The principle of this fund creates interest which will be made available each year to the Sacred Heart Academy middle and high school language arts teachers.
