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Morey Foundation, Isabella County High School Talent Contest

The Isabella County High School Talent Contest has been sponsored by the Morey Foundation for the past seven years. The high schools in Isabella County (Beal City High School, Mount



Pleasant High School, Sacred Heart Academy, and Shepherd High School) are invited to send up to three performing acts with up to five people in each act. The performing acts included are musical (vocal and instrumental), dance, and dramatic arts (drama, poetry, comedy, etc.).

Each high school can use their own process for selecting their participating acts. At Sacred Heart, we have used private auditions with faculty members or an assembly to perform in front of the student body. Once the acts are selected, they attend a dress rehearsal to prepare their act for the show. This usually lasts three to five hours.

Locations for the show have changed over the history of the Talent Contest. For the first four years, the Broadway Theatre in Mount Pleasant was used. The last three years, participating schools were asked to host, including Mount Pleasant High School, Shepherd High School and Beal City High School.

Each act is individually scored on how the judge enjoys the performance, its creativity, the execution of the act and stage presence. This year Sacred Heart Academy received \$20,000 for 1st place performances and \$5,000 for 1st place in the Poster contest. All the winnings go to the school and must be used to benefit the fine arts programs or the school as a whole. Throughout the seven year existence of the Talent Contest, Sacred Heart Academy students have won over \$72,000 for our school.

SCIENCE OLYMPIAD

Science Olympiad is a state wide school competition where students can compete in a variety of 23 events that include laboratory tasks, engineering challenges or tests in areas from astronomy, forestry, epidemiology, earth science to microbiology.

Students in grades 7-9 compete in a middle school division while grades 10-12 compete in a high school division. Our Sacred Heart Academy teams have earned numerous awards, including state championships in "Protein Modeling" and "Anatomy," as well as the middle school team being named "Best New Team" in the state of Michigan in 2010. The students, along with their coaches and mentors, have worked hard to win regional championships in each

division the last two years. They will compete in the 2012 regional competition at Alma College and hope to earn a spot at the state finals at Michigan State University in April.

As Admissions Director I'm happy to report that enrollment has stayed pretty steady here at Sacred Heart Academy during the past 6 years. We currently have 455 students in developmental kindergarten through 12th grade as compared to 460 in 2007-08. There continues to be two classrooms at each grade level in the elementary, making for an average classroom size of about 17 students. While Sacred Heart Academy is a Catholic school, we continue to be known as an excellent college prep school. One hundred percent of our students graduate and nearly 100% go on to college. Due to the strong partnership between parents and our dedicated teachers and staff, students are able to reach their highest potential. We continue to score high on standardized tests. Of the 18 areas that our students were tested in for the 2011 MEAP (Michigan Educational Assessment Program), SHA students had the highest percent of students proficient or advanced in 16 of the 18 areas in comparison to area schools. The 11th graders continue to score high on the MME (Michigan Merit Exam) and many times have the highest scores in the subject areas tested in comparison to area high schools.

We are so blessed at Sacred Heart Academy to have families who care deeply about their children's education and are willing to do whatever is necessary to help their children succeed. With such limited funding, it would not be possible to do all the things we do without the support of our families. Parents not only make financial contributions, but they also provide unlimited support in the form of time and talents. Parents volunteer on a regular basis both in the classroom and outside of the classroom, in the cafeteria, on the playgrounds, as chaperones on fieldtrips, and as coaches and advisors. The list goes on and on. This is a large part of what makes Sacred Heart Academy different from other schools. Our families feel an obligation to get involved and help out wherever they are needed. When you have a strong partnership between parents and teachers, the students can't help but succeed.



This spring we are very busy with families signing up for kindergarten round up and others wanting to learn more about Sacred Heart Academy for their older children. I'm always proud to take a prospective family around our buildings for a visit. Our students are very cordial and the teachers are always very welcoming of the "interruption". It's times like this that make me feel glad that I am part of Sacred Heart Academy and all that it has to offer its students and families.

After 123 years, Sacred Heart Academy is still as strong as ever. Enrollment is steady, the budget is balanced, and the students are

achieving their full potential --- academically, personally and extracurricularly.

We recently celebrated our 18th annual SHAgala event. In case you aren't familiar with it, SHAgala is the premier fundraiser for Sacred Heart Academy. The black tie affair includes valet parking, cocktail hour, a sit down dinner, oral and silent auctions, cash raffle, dancing and midnight snack. We have come to depend on this event as a major source of funding, specifically \$135,000 for 2011-12. Due to the hard work of numerous volunteers and the generosity of hundreds of donors, this year's event raised \$150,000, surpassing the budgeted amount by \$15,000. This is just one example of how the volunteers at Sacred Heart Academy give so freely of their time, talent and treasures.

Last spring, as we began planning for the 2011-12 school year, we began by implementing a theme that we would use throughout the year, "SHA.... leading the way to pray." As the year unfolded many positive things came about because of our focus on prayer. We now have a Book of Intentions in the entrance area of the elementary and high school buildings, along with a link on our home page where students, staff and parents may enter prayer requests that are then presented at our weekly masses. We utilized one of our teacher's artistic abilities and added a few religious symbols to our gymnasium.



Now when visitors enter our gym they can easily tell that this is a Catholic school with Jesus Christ as our leader. A recognition program was recently added where teachers recognize students who have made meaningful contributions to the values and mission of Sacred Heart Academy. Students are chosen on a monthly basis and presented with a certificate.

A community service program was implemented a number of years ago which requires all students to volunteer a minimum of 100 hours during 7th through 12th grade. The last couple of years, our juniors and seniors have reached out to many of our elder parishioners and shut-ins to help with their fall clean up. They raked leaves, stored patio furniture and replaced screen windows. Many of our students have several hundreds of volunteer hours and all have met the 100 hour requirement by the time they graduate. It is programs like this that set our students apart from other high school students. As you know, the volunteer youth of today will become the volunteer adults of the future.

Hello, my name is Bret Hyble. I serve as the Development Director raising funds for Sacred Heart Parish, Sacred Heart Academy and Sacred Heart Academy Foundation. Gifts to Sacred Heart come in many different shapes and sizes, but they all have a common thread of supporting an interest the donor has, while allowing Sacred Heart to thrive through financial charity. It is amazing how much we achieve through the charity of gifts, volunteered time and talents of our Parish community and alumni. Following are a few examples of the ongoing charity at Sacred Heart.

- In the fall of 2011 Sacred Heart Academy partnered with Krapohl Ford for a "Drive One 4UR School" fundraiser. The Ford Motor Company sponsored event gives the participating school \$20 for each test drive taken. We held a Back to School Picnic prior to a home football game, organized by Home and School Association, and with the help of many Sacred Heart Academy families, raised over \$8,000 for the Academy.
- The National Honor Society at Sacred Heart Academy held a Soup and Sandwich fundraiser during Catholic Schools Week to raise money for the local Soup Kitchen. Over 325 people were served dinner and \$1,066 was raised. Many parents and students had fun with this event while supporting a worthy cause.
- Near the end of the 2011 calendar year, the Academy received a large screen television as a gift-in-kind donation that is now being used in the classroom.
- Sacred Heart Parish received a gift of stocks this past
 December to offset the electric expenses of the Church.
- Recently, two new scholarships have been created to support students of Sacred Heart Academy. The Dr. Leonard E. and Louise A. Plachta Endowed Scholarship supports current students of Sacred Heart Academy, while the Myler Family Scholarship Fund supports graduating seniors as they pursue a college education.

All these examples are charity to our Catholic community and Sacred Heart Academy. When we all help a little, we make great strides as a group. YEARBOOKS...
