OUR SCHOOL

Founded in 1889, Sacred Heart Academy has provided the opportunity for both spiritual and academic growth for over 130 years. Sacred Heart Academy is a Catholic school in the state of Michigan with approximately 200 students in grades 7-12. The Academy also includes KP-6 education in a separate building, with approximately 250 students in kinder-prep-6th grade, on the Sacred Heart Campus located in downtown Mount Pleasant. As a member of the Diocese of Saginaw and the Gratiot-Isabella RESD, Sacred Heart Academy is accredited by the Michigan Association of Non-Public Schools (MANS). Drawing students from more than five different counties, Sacred Heart Academy represents one of the few remaining Catholic high schools in northern lower Michigan. In addition to our rigorous, college preparatory curriculum, students participate in daily prayer and theology classes, frequently assist in community outreach initiatives, and attend weekly Masses, while also fulfilling a graduation requirement of performing 100 community service hours.

OUR COMMUNITY

Located 155 miles northwest of Detroit at the heart of Michigan's lower peninsula, Mount Pleasant is a community of approximately 25,000 residents. Mount Pleasant is an increasingly diversifying area with an economy significantly based around Central Michigan University and the McLaren and Mid-Michigan Medical facilities. With the opening of CMU's medical school, there has been a further increase in health science professionals populating the Mount Pleasant area. In general, Isabella and Gratiot, the two counties where the majority of Sacred Heart Academy students reside, are rural communities with a strong emphasis on agriculture, natural resources, and various trade programs.

OUR STUDENTS

The student body at SHA is made up of students from diverse backgrounds who are looking to develop the skills needed to reach their college and career goals within a learning environment based on Christian morals. SHA is welcoming of students of all faiths (1/3 of our students are not Catholic) and those with specific learning needs. Approximately 11% of Sacred Heart families receive financial aid, as our goal is to make a high-quality Catholic education affordable and available for as many students as possible. The ethnic/racial makeup of our student population is similar to that of Mount Pleasant: 3% Black/African American, 4% Hispanic/Latino, 2% Asian, 88% Caucasian, and 3% American Indian.

Sacred Heart Academy, a Catholic school founded in 1889, guided by the Holy Spirit, is committed to the mission of Jesus Christ. With our families and faith community, nourished by the Eucharist, we provide a balanced curriculum to strengthen mind, body, and spirit, so each student fulfills God's purpose.
