## St. James, Bay City

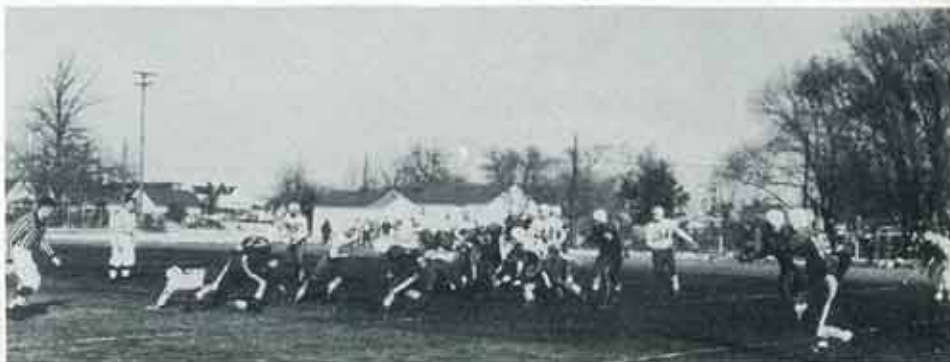
The "Irish" of Sacred Heart successfully launched their 1951 football season with impressive win over St. James, Bay City.

The Irish drove to the 11-yard line and from there Quarterback Dick Marzke skirted right end for the score. Later in the second period Pat Quinlan brought the fans to their feet as he scored on an off-tackle play from the 19-yard line. It was two accurate passes thrown by Marzke that accounted for twelve more points in the third quarter. On the receiving end were Pat Quinlan and Jim McKenna. St. James tallied 13 points in the fourth quarter but was on the short end of a 24-13 final score. The game increased the team's wins to 19 straight.



## Kingston

On October 28, S. H. A. brought its victory streak to 21 games without a loss or tie. Bill Quinlan broke off tackle for the first Irish score. Dick Marzke scored the second T. D., but the try for placement went awry. Mike Fleming also tallied in the first half by dashing six yards. The kick was good and the score at halftime, 22-0. The scoring was climaxed by a brilliant run of a fake punt by Pat Quinlan. The extra point was not good and the final score read 28-0.



## St. Mary's, Flint

The Sacred Heart Eleven played their first home game on October 1, defeating St. Mary's Flint 19 to 6. This victory marked the 20th consecutive victory for the Sacred Heart team. The Irish started with a bang by scoring two touchdowns in the first five minutes of the game. Pat Quinlan smashed through for 15 yards to score the first touchdown in the opening minutes. The second touchdown was scored by Bill Quinlan a few minutes later on a 21-yard run. There were no further threats until the third quarter when Quarterback Dick Marzke plunged from the four for the final score. The St. Mary team sparked a drive to the final period to score their only touchdown.

## Beal City

The Irish machine ground out Beal City 32-0 in their 22nd consecutive win. The first score came on a six-play drive from the 50-yard line with Marzke driving around right end for the first score. The second came when B. Quinlan grabbed an Aggie fumble on the 29. It was Quinlan's T. D. all the way. In the third quarter Marzke went off tackle for a 61-yard drive and another score. Pat Quinlan scored from the six, Bill Martin caught a pass for the last T. D. Bill Quinlan was the outstanding player with 78 yards in 8 tries.

Though badly outweighed and dangerously short on reserve strength, the Irish gave SS. Peter and Paul's a battle royal before succumbing to a 19-12 score.

Academy drew first blood in the contest as guard Tom McEvoy crashed through from his position to scoop up a blocked Midget punt and scamper 20 yards for the game's first counter.

The Midgets, spearheaded by pile-driving fullback Dick Mendyki answered the Irish challenge with a three-touchdown spree, putting them on top 19-6 as the half ended.

The Irish were an entirely different ball club the second half as they dominated the play the remainder of the contest. Academy scored again while holding the Midgets scoreless in the last period. Line-play of the Irish was especially noteworthy in view of the fact that they were outweighed nearly
