This year there were not many new players only two freshmen played.


Coach McCann also said "that the new players helped greatly & played really well."




A new comer to Varsity Basketball this year, Brian Rush, stated that what he liked most about basketball was "the pressure to perform each and every game like it was his last.




"Play Ball"
